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## **Old Brewery Mission**

Once a month, for three hours at the end of the school day, 10 students along with Ms. Garner (Planning Room Tech.) and Mrs. Higgins (Cycle 1 V-P), and sometimes a volunteer parent, leave Macdonald High School to go to the **Old Brewery Mission** located in Montreal.

**"The Old Brewery Mission was founded in 1889 and provides homeless Montreal adults with meals, overnight shelter, transitional residences, clothing, and services in an atmosphere of caring and respect. They gain greater stability and autonomy, and build more mainstream lives." (OBM - Mission Statement).**



Upon arrival at the Old Brewery Mission, we, and the other volunteers set the tables, serve the meals, serve coffee, clear tables, and repeat as many times as is necessary, for as many as 300-400 homeless men and women. Also, before or after the meal, a worker from the Mission takes

us all on a tour. This gives the students a chance to see the facility, ask questions, and **learn more about the people who are homeless in Montreal.**

## Twice the work and twice the fun!!!!

Term two is already over, and the robotics team has been very busy. We have finished our courses on basic electronics, tool safety and usage, fabrication techniques, welding and drafting.



Our emphasis now is on participating in the CRC Robotics competition, which is a competition between private and public high schools and colleges in the Montreal area designed to promote an interest in science and technology and how to work professionally.



The competition requires each school to build a robot made to meet a certain standard challenge, create a display/workshop kiosk, and a

video, website and journal each in bilingual format, talking about our school, the robot and the competition. This is a truly cross curricular project and involves all grades and parts of the school in some way. We have had our kickoff night for the competition and have learned what our challenge is. This year we are required to work with other teams to collect tennis balls dropped into our robot, to drive across the play-



ing field, to open garage doors and shoot the tennis balls into the right ones for points. This will require a lot of cooperation with other schools at the competition.

Due to our larger size and increased skills this year, we are entering not one, but TWO teams into the competition. This calls for us to produce two of each aspect of the competition, including two separate robots, kiosks, websites, videos and journals. This is a lot of work,

but is a challenge we are up for.

We are working hard for a minimum of 10 hours a week right now to finalize our projects in time for the competi-
