

THE MATHEMATICS DEPARTMENT

First term has flown by quickly with the usual events: **Grade Seven Day, Meet the Teacher and Open House**. The Math Department is efficiently adjusting to Curriculum Reform in Secondary IV. The teachers have been to many workshops since last June in order to be able to teach and evaluate the three levels of grade 10 math according to the demands of the Quebec Government. The three math options are: **Cultural Science and Technology (Math 434)**,



Science and Technology (Math 446) and Science (Math 456). The students are being assessed through communication, reasoning and situational problems. Although the teachers believe in teaching math to their students, it has become very clear that we also need to teach our students to learn math. Success in math is directly related to the important strategy of developing strong work ethics. We




expect all students to work on math every evening whether they have written homework or not. When en students don't have written work, they can review the concepts and questions that they had difficulties with. A suggested time frame for every evening would be twenty minutes in Sec I, twenty-five minutes in Sec II, thirty minutes in Sec III, forty minutes in Sec IV and fifty minutes in Sec V.



Life lessons from Cervantes

enaissance man Bryan Brazeau, BA (western soc. & cult.) o8, couldn't decide whether he should pursue his PhD in Italian or Spanish after he graduated with honours from Concordia's Liberal Arts College (LAC).

Brazeau enjoys both Latin languages. and had learned them well enough to be able to read the classics of Dante and Cervantes in their original texts. So he applied to both the Italian and Spanish programs at Harvard, Stanford, Yale and New York University (NYU), and was accepted at all of them with



Already fluent in English and French, Bryan Brazeau learned Italian and Spanish and will soon tackle German and Latin.

six years of full funding.

"Cervantes said the life of a soldier and the life of a student aren't very different, so I conducted my application process like a military campaign," Brazeau explains. "I lined up six or seven letters [even though only three are needed] from professors and told each one what I wanted from them. Then, I selected a different combination of recommendations for each school I applied to based on a variety of factors."

Brazeau appreciated the LAC faculty members' expansive attitudes toward learning, the College's immense reading list, the close relationships of its students and teachers and its invitation to students to reach higher and dig deeper.

He discovered that Oxford University has a summer institute in Medieval and Renaissance Studies, and persuaded its administrators to offer him a bursary. Brazeau was also the recipient of the 2007-08 Lois & Stan Tucker Scholarship that has been established for LAC students.

Despite his intense study requirements, Brazeau still found time for an active student life. He was president of the LAC student society for one year and performed theatre on the side. He often worked 20 hours to 30 hours per week at Second Cup coffee shops. And his fluency in English and French helped him land a job as a 9-1-1 dispatcher for the City of Montreal.

With a grade point average well over 4.0, Brazeau chose NYU's Italian program for his doctorate beginning this fall. He says the program is "the Liberal Arts College writ large . . . and in Italian."

Brazeau has already assigned himself homework for the next few years. "I really have to improve my Latin and learn some German," he says.


